## School Uniform Policy

### 1 Introduction

1.1 It is our policy that children can wear a school uniform which consists of a pale blue polo shirt and a blue sweatshirt, both with the school logo on. A blue checked dress can be worn in summer with white socks and sandals. However, no child will be discriminated against should they/their parents wish them to wear non-uniform items. We provide a list of the items available for school uniform from the suppliers Pierce and Buckland or badges to sew on

### 2 Aims and objectives

2.1 Our policy is based on the notion that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- engenders a feeling of community and belonging;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.

### 3 Jewellery

3.1 Children are not permitted to wear jewellery during PE and games.

### 4 Extreme haircuts

4.1 The school hopes that parents act responsibly in the choice of haircuts for their children.

### 5 Footwear

5.1 On the grounds of health and safety, we ask parents to dress children in sensible rather than fashionable clothes and footwear. Trainers should be worn only for PE. Flip flops are not permitted.

6. Children should change into a PE kit for physical activity. The PE kit comprises of white plain T shirt, navy or black shorts and plimsolls. Tracksuit and trainers required for outdoor use.
